Many hands make for successful Laurelville fire clean-up Laurelville Retreat Center, Mount Pleasant, PA, www.laurelville.org



On Monday, Feb. 21, nearly 70 people spent a sunny day helping Laurelville Retreat Center clean up the site where its maintenance building burned to the ground in the wee hours of the morning on Feb. 12. We are thankful to God that no one was hurt in the fire.

The loss was estimated to be over \$400,000 including the building, vehicles, tools, and supplies. The fire was determined to have started in the building's furnace or air compressor. Laurelville has insurance. Insurance gaps on contents have already been met by donors! The support received to date has been completely overwhelming. Volunteers came from the local community, Pittsburgh and several states, plus churches and other Christian camps sent helpers (including MCA friends from Cove Valley Camp) - we met friends we didn't know we had. We feel very loved, appreciated, and valued. People and businesses have been so generous. By day's end, the site was nearly cleared of all debris and the former concrete floor was visible. We have already seen beauty emerging from the ashes.

The long list of items that still need to be replaced include side-by-side utility terrain vehicles, golf carts, high ropes course equipment, and a pick-up truck. A wish list is posted at www.laurelville.org for any camps who may have equipment to share. Laurelville plans to rebuild as soon as possible.
